The department now consists of 1 chief, 1 inspector, 1 captain, 6 lieutenants, 45 detectives, 29 sergeants, 588 patrolmen, 1 surgeon, 1 secretary, 3 assistant secretaries, 1 clerk stenographer, 1 clerk, 1 chief operator, 8 operators, 1 matron, 6 janitors; total 694.

Total number of arrests, 10,545; an increase of 1047 over the previous year.
